In 2017, **74 children** found a place of love, hope and belonging at Whaley Children's Center. Thirty-seven of these children were boys and thirty-seven were girls. Our children come from **28 different counties** throughout Michigan.

At the average age of 12 years old, they were all scared, nervous and confused. Each child wondering where they would be going next, considering each of them had been to approximately four to six foster homes before finally getting placed at Whaley. In total, they have been to 348 placements before coming to the Center.





Most of the children who come to live at Whaley Children's Center have fallen victim to more than one type of child abuse. The horrific trauma our children have experienced is shocking.

72%neglect

56% physical abuse

37% sexual abuse

31% witnessed substance abuse

27% domestic violence

However, because of the dedicated staff, volunteers and donors of Whaley Children's Center, these statistics do not have to define our children's futures. Through our CARF accredited program and services, we work to transform their lives and create futures for Michigan's most fragile youth. Through extensive therapy and life skills training, the 40 children who live at Whaley are well on their way to having the happy and healthy life every child deserves.
