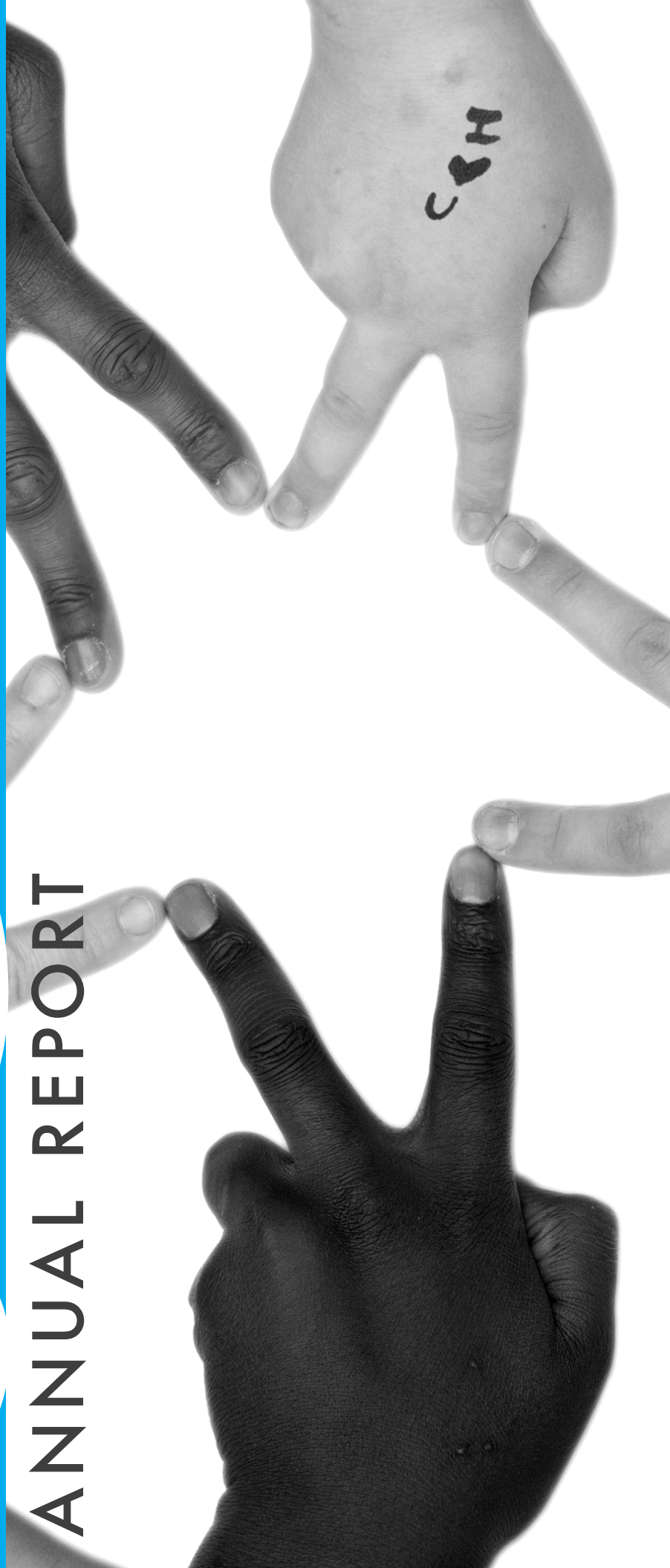

We have so much to be proud of in 2019. The changes and ideas we have made at the Center will better serve our kids in our care. It has always been my goal to make Whaley feel like home and for our kiddos to have memories and experiences that every child deserves. Change started immediately. From celebrating everything from birthdays to accomplishments to small improvements. Change also came in the form of renovations and better training for our staff.

In May, we partnered with Mott Children's Health Center to create a clinic on campus. Doctors and dentists can be scary to a child, but by having a clinic on campus that provides medical and dental services to our children creates an environment that feels safe and comfortable to them.

Plans to renovate our Mott Cottages are underway. A grant from the Carl's Foundation allowed us to replace the roof of the cottages. Due to the generosity shown at the 2019 Tux and Tennies Gala and Auction, we are able to fully fund a complete renovation to our living quarters for our kids. This makes the area they live in feel even more like home.

It has been so important for me that everyone on our team from those working directly with our children to our administration staff works towards trauma-informed care. I'm excited to share that we are the first residential facility in Michigan to partner with Western Michigan's Child Trauma Assessment Center to receive a trauma-informed care endorsement.

While visiting Arizona, I took a tour of a similar agency and noticed they had a resale shop that helped not only their facility but local foster children. Being inspired by that trip and knowing the difficulties a child that ages out faces, made way to opening our very own retail shop. We opened Reclaimed by Whaley, an upscale resale boutique in the heart of Flint. It gives preferred employment to current and former foster youth. One hundred percent of the proceeds benefits our kids at Whaley.

Change would not be possible without our community. They believe so strongly in our mission and are such big advocates of the work we do at our Center. The people who work here are the most selfless, kind, open-minded, determined humans I've ever met. They are family. Together we create the village to support these kids and make them feel safe and loved. I know together with our community and our Whaley family anything is possible.

We strive to be leaders in the treatment of at-risk children and their families and creating an environment that fosters positive change and growth.

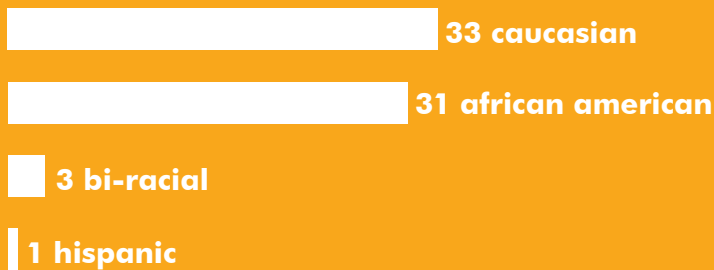
